By way of the most dramatic coastal and pastoral scenery, this tour of Ireland leads you to the lesser-known gems of the Emerald Isle as well as the cliffs, castles, and famous crystal you’ve long heard of. As you hum along the winding Ring of Kerry and the rocky Aran Islands, this tour of Ireland “will steal your heart away.”

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DAY BY DAY ITINERARY

DAY 1: ARRIVE IN DUBLIN, IRELAND. Céad mile fáilte—a hundred-thousand welcomes! At 3pm, meet your Tour Director and traveling companions for an afternoon orientation drive, including O'Connell Street, St. Patrick's Cathedral, and Trinity College. (D)

DAY 2: DUBLIN–KILDARE–STROKESTOWN–BALLINA. KILDARE Visit the Irish National Stud. STROKESTOWN Guided tour of the 1740s mansion and gardens at Strokestown House and the Famine Museum. (B,D)

DAY 3: BALLINA–KYLEMORE–GALWAY. Via Westport, head for the Connemara region. CONNEMARA Visit Kylemore Abbey. Visit the Joyce family at their marble workshop at Moycullen. GALWAY Free time. ENHANCE YOUR FREE TIME in Galway with an evening at Dunguaire Castle, including a literary-themed banquet. This and many more options throughout your tour are available for purchase with MyGlobus. DAY 4: GALWAY. EXCURSION TO THE ARAN ISLANDS. Ferry crossing to Inishmore, the largest of the Aran Islands. INISHMORE At Ti Joe Watty's pub hear from a local about life on Inishmore over a light lunch. A minibus tour of the island with a local guide-driver includes a visit to the prehistoric clifftop fort of Dun Aengus. (B,L,)

DAY 5: GALWAY–CLIFFS OF MOHER–LIMERICK. RATHBAUNTRY your hand at scone baking, learn about sheep herding, and enjoy coffee and your scones at an Irish farm. CLARE COAST See The Burren and stop for photos of prehistoric Poul nabrone Dolmen. CLIFFS OF MOHER Visit the 668-foot-high rocky cliffs above the Atlantic Ocean. (B)

DAY 6: LIMERICK–FOYNES–DINGLE PENINSULA–KILLARNEY. FOYNES Guided tour of the Flying Boat Museum followed by Irish coffee demonstration and tasting. DINGLE PENINSULA Scenic drive on Sleah Head promontory. (B)

DAY 7: KILLARNEY. EXCURSION TO RING OF KERRY. RING OF KERRY Panoramic drive around the island's southwestern tip. KILLARNEY Horse-drawn jaunting-car ride through the national park with vistas of the Lakes of Killarney and Ross Castle. (B,D)

DAY 8: KILLARNEY–BLARNEY–WATERFORD. Cross the Kerry Mountains into County Cork. BLARNEY Visit the village renowned for its magical Kissing Stone with free time to explore. WATERFORD Guided tour of the House of Waterford Crystal. (B,D)

DAY 9: WATERFORD–AVOCA–DUBLIN. AVOCA Watch the weavers at work in Ireland's oldest handweaving mill. DUBLIN Free time this afternoon. (B)

DAY 10: DUBLIN. DUBLIN Your vacation ends with breakfast this morning. (B)
